

MONEY

WHERE TO GET TURKISH LIRA WHEN YOU ARRIVE IN TURKEY

You can convert your local currency to Turkish Lira once you arrive at the airport or you can find an ATM to withdraw Turkish Lira. We would suggest finding one of the national bank ATMs such as Garanti Bank, Yapi Kredi Bank, Vakifbank, or Isbank.

Be sure to check with your bank on any fees for withdrawing foreign currency overseas. Note you will typically get a better exchange rate during the week when changing or withdrawing money in Turkey.

CREDIT CARDS

Turkey is credit card friendly, but it is good to have cash on hand.

Check with your bank before your trip to see if they will charge any additional fees for using your card abroad. If they do, it's worth doing some research and getting a card that caters to international travelers and has lower fees.

As you are planning your trip to Turkey, be sure to notify your bank and credit cards when and where you will be traveling so, they do not put a block on your card due to unusual activity during your trip.

TIPPING IN TURKEY

When you travel in larger cities, you'll find that there is an expectation for tipping among service providers. If you're in more rural areas, you'll find that there is not an expectation but genuine surprise and appreciation when a tip is given. Following are suggestions on tipping in Turkey:

RESTAURANTS

When eating at a restaurant with **waitstaff** who've taken your order at your table, generally an acceptable tip would be **10% of the total bill**. Most restaurants will not add a tip to the bill, but be sure to check your final bill before paying. If there is a "service charge" on the bill, the tip is included, and you do need to tip extra.

"If you're paying by credit card, you will not be able to include your tip on the credit card charge. Pay cash."

TRAVEL SERVICE PROVIDERS

In **hotels**, you can tip each person service - concierge, bell boy, room service, hotel staff, etc for each occasion they provide a service. 50 - 100 Turkish Lira per service is acceptable.

For **travel guides**, a **10% - 20% tip** is appropriate at the end of your time together if you feel that they did a good job and you enjoyed their services. In addition, if you have a **driver**, you can provide an additional tip of 50 Turkish Lira to them. The tip you provide to the guide will not be shared with the driver.

You will need to pay the tip in Turkish Lira cash and give the tip directly to the service provider.

It's polite to tip **taxi drivers** a few extra Turkish Lira in cash.







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WEATHER

To <u>plan your first trip to Turkey</u>, you want to go when the weather is great. Depending on what you want to do and where you want to go, there are best times to travel to Turkey. Generally, the best time to visit is April to October. Here's what you can expect:

SPRING | MARCH - MAY

In March and April, the weather is starting to warm up and it's a great time to explore without it being too hot or humid. In the cities, you'll find flowers and specifically in Istanbul, the famous tulips will be blooming.

SUMMER | JUNE - AUGUST

This is the peak tourist season. It's hot and you'll find the prices higher during this time. Expect high humidity and temperatures along the coastal regions of Turkey. It's a great time to enjoy the beach and swim in the Mediterranean.

FALL | SEPTEMBER - NOVEMBER

The tourist season begins to slow down and you may see rain in November. You'll find the classic sites to still be a buzz but less crowded than in the summer months. This is our favorite time of the year to travel in Turkey.

WINTER | DECEMBER - FEBRUARY

These are the cold months with a slow amount of activity happening across the major cities. In Istanbul and the northern part of Turkey, you'll have snow and rain and along the coast, you'll have torrential rain that blows through regularly. You can still plan on visiting the classic sites, just remember your winter coats, hat, and gloves.

CAPPADOCIA



A visit to Cappadocia, Turkey is a stunning location that seems straight out of a fairytale. This region is magical with rock formations (also known as "fairy chimneys"), hidden cities, and colorful <u>hot air</u> <u>balloons</u> floating high in the sky to capture the sunrise.

ACCOMMODATIONS

When traveling in Turkey with kids, the first thing to note is that hotel rooms are small, more along the size of European standards. If you are a family of four, you will probably have to book a family suite to stay in the same room together. If your kids are older, you can potentially book two rooms at the hotel. Check with your hotel about what they suggest and the rooms they have available to accommodate your family.

5-STAR HOTELS

In all of the major travel locations in Turkey, guests will find options for 5-star hotels that are perfect for family travel. Some will have all-inclusive options, more amenities, and larger rooms available for families.

LUXURY BOUTIQUE HOTELS

Luxury boutique hotels are a great option for a dressedup "Turkish Experience". Typically, the rooms have been renovated in an ottoman style with luxury finishes. They'll have smaller rooms and possibly have a few larger rooms for a family of 4. Depending on the age of your kids, you may need to book 2 rooms if you stay in a luxury boutique hotel. Usually, Turkish breakfast is included with your stay.

APART HOTELS

Apart hotels are great if you want more space, have young kids, or have a larger family. You can find aparthotels that have multiple rooms and a small kitchen included. It's nice if you want to cook some meals or have younger kids that need a little more space. The downside is you'll miss the amenities and service of the hotels and have to be set up or have a plan for breakfast each morning.

BUDGET HOTELS

Budget hotels can be a great option when you are traveling on a budget with your family. The rooms will be basic and clean. Keep in mind the rooms will be small and you will probably need to book multiple room for over 3 people.
